Peggy Fleener Hatfield, 77, a resident of Martinsville, passed from this life after an extended illness at 1:18 a.m. on Wednesday, May 11, 2016 in the comfort of her own home. She was born on January 9, 1939 in Martinsville, Indiana, to the late James and Evelyn (Fletcher) Hayden.

Peggy spent most all of her life in Martinsville excluding the few years in Stinesville, Indiana, where she attended high school. She furthered her education, graduating from Ivy Tech School of Nursing in 1974 as a licensed practical nurse. Peggy worked throughout the 1970's and into the early 1980's in the obstetrics unit at Morgan Hospital in Martinsville. On May 5, 1979 she married Doug Hatfield; he preceded her in death on February 4, 2007. She and Doug took to the road as a 'truck driving team' in 1982, hauling freight and traveling the United States until she retired in 1999. Peggy found great pleasure in truck driving with Doug, traveling, camping, reading and crocheting, though her greatest joy was time spent her with family.

She was a member of the Mt. Olive Country Chapel in Martinsville.

Peggy will undoubtedly be missed and lovingly remembered by her family and friends including her four sons, Steve, Brian and Jeff Fleener all of Martinsville and David Fleener of Greenville, SC; one daughter, Debbie Flake of Plainfield, IN; one brother, John Hayden of Martinsville; eleven grandchildren and eleven great grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Doug Hatfield; parents; first husband, Wilburn Fleener; one brother, George Hayden; three sisters, Ruth Mattingly, Shirley Tapp and Virginia Wilson; one grandson, Robert Flake.
